



From the Vicar

MAKING ALL THINGS NEW

Well, this certainly is an Easter like no other. I am writing this on the Wednesday of Easter week with a memory of having walked up on to the side of Black Hill for a solitary – apart from two spaniels – vigil at dawn and then down for the Deanery Service on YouTube.

The absence of all the surrounding jollities at the very least enabled me – and many others – to focus on what Easter is actually about. Which is a helpful thing, as, when you look back to that first Easter, there were many reactions – shock, puzzlement, disbelief, excitement, fear, awe – but simple joy or jollity were not there. And that is for obvious and understandable reasons. For Jesus's followers, the resurrection changed everything, and it takes a while for that realisation to be taken on board.

And life really had changed for them. They might revert to their old occupations, but, as those fishermen disciples discovered in that wonderful story at the end of John's gospel – the knowledge and understanding of the presence of the risen Christ in their lives even transformed their work.

That message of transformation is vital. It is – let's face it – all too easy for us to go through all the rituals of Holy Week and Easter without it necessarily changing everything. This year, however, the world around us has changed unimaginably, and that allows us to look at how it has changed, and how that will change us, both individually, and collectively.

There are obvious things: many people have discovered it is perfectly possible to work from home; many people have shown active care and concern for the people around them; many people, apparently, have discovered the importance of washing hands; many people have discovered how important, and how easy it is, to keep in touch with those they love; and many, I hope, in the church and elsewhere have discovered that meetings are not necessarily all they are cracked up to be.

And many in the church have discovered new ways of spreading the good news of God's love. The headlines may say 'Churches are shut', and that reveals a sad and prevalent attitude to what 'churches' actually are. They are not buildings: they are groups of people, and, while church buildings provide a wonderful numinous presence where people can feel themselves at peace with God, you cannot have church without people, while you can have church without buildings. And that is something which has been so apparent this Holy Week and Easter. Having to find new ways of connecting has been a really good challenge. There has been much communication both on paper and online, a huge sharing of ideas for prayer, for worship, for discovery and for fun on the Abbeydore Deanery Facebook page and, as I write this, over twenty videos of homegrown worship on the Abbeydore Deanery YouTube channel, which will obviously remain there and which will equally obviously grow. And what has been really wonderful is the fact clearly attested by people's responses - that this is drawing more new people into the community of the church.

What is absolutely obvious is that, when the current crisis is over, we cannot simply go back to what life was like before. We have new people to feed along with all those who have been faithful members of the body of Christ for years. How we do that is something for which your views will be more than welcome. And if you have time to think of any, do let me know. Christ came to make all things new: here is a wonderful opportunity for us to bring that about. *Nicholas*

A group of us is meeting on line every Wednesday evening for the wonderful and peaceful service of Compline: if you would like to join us, do please drop me an email.

And we keep together quietly. I have suggested that we set aside 8.00pm on a Tuesday for quiet prayer, and it is immensely powerful, believe me, to know that people are praying together, even when you can't see them. If there is anyone or anything that you would like prayed for at that time, do please let me know. *Nicholas*

OFGEM - About the Priority Services Register

The Priority Services Register is a free service provided by energy suppliers (Gas and Electricity) and network operators. Each energy supplier and network operator maintains its own register. To get on it, you need to contact your energy supplier.

Who is eligible? You are eligible if you:

- are of pensionable age
- are disabled or chronically sick
- have a long-term medical condition
- have a hearing or visual impairment or additional communication needs
- are in a vulnerable situation.
- You may also be eligible for priority services from your supplier and/or network operator if you live with a child under five years old.

How to get on the register

You need to contact your energy supplier to get on the Priority Services Register. Each energy supplier and network operator maintains its own register.

You can ask your supplier to pass your details on to your network operator, especially if you are dependent on your supply for medical reasons or if you have children under five years old.

If you have a different supplier for your gas and electricity, you need to contact them both.

If you switch supplier, you'll need to register for the service again with them.

Help you can get by being on the register

Advance notice of planned power cuts. If you rely medically on your energy supply you can arrange for the company that runs the local energy network (the network operator) to give you advance notice of planned power cuts. For example, when they plan to carry out engineering work.

<u>Priority support in an emergency</u>. This could involve the local network operator providing alternative heating and cooking facilities in the event of a supply interruption.

<u>Identification scheme</u>. This is to reassure you that callers, for example meter readers, are genuine. Suppliers have to provide additional support to help you identify someone acting on behalf of their company. This could include arranging a password or showing an agreed picture card upon visit.

<u>Password protection</u>. Network operators must offer to agree a password with you (or your representative) that can be used by any representative of the company to enable you to identify them.

<u>Nominee scheme</u>. Customers can ask their supplier to send communications (such as account statements or bills) to someone you have nominated who agrees to receive them. For example, this could be a family member, carer or someone you trust.

Arrangements to ensure that it's safe and practical for you to use your prepayment meter. For example moving a prepayment meter if you are unable to access it safely to top it up.

<u>Meter reading services at appropriate intervals</u>. If nobody living at your property is able to read the meter and there isn't anyone else you can nominate to read the meter on your behalf, your supplier may be able to read it for you.

<u>Accessible information</u>. Account and bill information in an accessible format, for example in larger print or braille.

Similar support services

Suppliers and network operators may also offer you other similar services relevant to your needs, where it is reasonable to do so. Ask them how they can support you.

Suppliers provide free gas safety checks (e.g. for appliances such as a gas boiler) for homeowners. These are available once every 12 months. You are eligible for this service if you:

- get a means-tested benefit and live with a child under five.
- live alone and are of pensionable age, disabled or chronically sick and live alone.
- live with others who are of pensionable age, disabled, chronically sick or under 18 and you are also of pensionable age, disabled or chronically sick.

Contact your supplier to request your free gas safety check if you're eligible and haven't had one in the last 12 months.

Free services similar to the Priority Services Register are available in the water, phone and public transport sectors. Some energy companies and network operators have agreed to work together with water companies to jointly signpost the extra help you can access for water and energy. We're encouraging all energy companies to do the same.

When self-isolating, call us 01873 860444 for our same day personal shopper service

- 1. We will call you back on a different number to keep our telephone line clear
- 2. We collate your items when you are on the phone, offering alternatives where needed.
- 3. Scanning it through our mobile till at the same time, then we take payment over the phone by card.
- 4. If you can drive we will put it in the boot of your car or we will arrange to have it delivered.
- 5. If you can't pay by card we are happy to accept cash or cheque this is not a problem

If you are thinking of having a newspaper everyday, we accept all newspaper vouchers and it will reduce the cost by 20% - 40%.

We accept Healthy Start Vouchers so please ask your health visitor if you are eligible and don't miss out.

Our refill shed is still operating **Thursday between 3pm and 6.30pm** with plant based Bio D cleaning products, Faith in Nature body products and Dr Bronner Lavender & Peppermint liquid 18 in 1 and the Little Soap Company **Organic** Grapefruit & Orange range, including a hand & body lotion. Book of the month - Alfred Watkins' Herefordshire in his own words and photographs

Alfred Watkins (1855–1935) was born in Hereford and lived all his life in Herefordshire. Best known for his discovery of ancient tracks (the 'Ley Lines' of his book, *The Old Straight Track*) he had many gifts and interests, and was especially keen on photography and his beloved Herefordshire.

The core of this book is an unpublished manuscript by Watkins entitled *The Masefield Country*, of 1931 – an evocative piece about Herefordshire and the area around Ledbury, inspired by John Masefield's glowing speech in praise of his native county when he accepted the Freedom of Hereford in 1930, after becoming Poet Laureate. The piece is composed of stories gleaned from Watkins' chance meetings with a variety of people on his travels, and reflects on three poets with Ledbury connections: William Langland, Elizabeth Barrett Browning and John Masefield. It is

full of asides, insights, wryly amusing anecdotes and deep feeling, coupled with respect for the rural wisdom of 'men of the soil', expressing his feelings for Herefordshire as a whole, and concern that it should sustain its traditional values and native wisdom in a fast-changing world.

Alfred Watkins' text is prefaced by an introduction to his life and work by Ron and Jennifer Shoesmith, and followed by a section on his pioneering photography and developments in photographic equipment. This extended revised edition includes more than 200 of his photographs of Herefordshire.

POST OFFICE

How to use Post Office Services - The Details

When self isolating, call us during Post Office Hours 01873 860444

- 1. We will log the call and a Post Office representative will call you back
- 2. We will advise the best course of action to limit exposure to yourself
- 3. When agreed we collect items from the boot of your car and process as agreed.
- 4. Next time we see you, all receipts and change will be given back to you via your car boot.

May Special Stamps are Coronation Street. Anyone wanting a presentation pack please ask at the Post Office or telephone an order if self-isolating.

Keep track and **pay your Council Tax, BT, Water, nPower,** at the Post Office on a day you choose. Come and talk to us about other bills you can pay.

SAVE TIME even more banks have joined our banking scheme with the Post Office, so pop in and see what you can do with **YOUR business or personal bank account**.

Many of the new online banks that sync perfectly with accounting software only offer banking at Post Offices as they don't have high street premises keeping their prices lower with access all over the Country.

Need to **top up your mobile phone**? Do it at Longtown Post Office. When the Post Office is not open, leave your card and cash, the next time it is open we will complete the transaction. Next time you are in the shop you can collect your receipt. This can also be a perfect gift to keep in touch.
